Mindset by Carol Dweck is an interesting book. I tried to get into it when I was nine, and I apparently told my dad it was stressing me out. Unsurprisingly, nine year olds don't like to grapple with ideas, like the ones in that book. Today, however, I read Mindset and it gives me hope. Let's walk through the basic proposition of the book, and find out how to improve our lives.

The Growth Mindset is the belief that your abilities can be improved through practice and work, as opposed to believing people are born with a fixed set of abilities. It's just that, but allow me to give a couple examples of where you can see and understand your own mindset and ideas. When you do poorly on a test, what is your reaction? Then, you fix that next time. You study more, employ an agenda, or email your teacher after absences.

For me, realizing this difference changed a lot of how I approached things. The most notable improvement for me was in how I viewed my artistic skills. I have always considered myself hopeless at art, but the book mentioned a story

of people who considered themselves average at art developing significant skills after a short workshop. I try to keep the growth mindset in mind as I produce unrecognizable works of art; knowing my ability to improve gives me more patience.

Enough about myself, the most important part of it to me is how we use it to improve all our lives. The growth mindset is an invaluable tool for becoming stronger academically, physically, and emotionally. I gave an example of academic improvement in the first paragraph. RUSSIA VS. UKRAINE

For a very long time Russia and Ukraine have had conflicts over land, there was even a situation in 2014. In very early 2022 Russia had built up their forces on the Ukraine border. Finally after so much speculation and buildup. Russia finally invaded Ukraine on february 24th. Russia had started with the invasion and has been bombing strategic and even civilian targets! Some of the civilian targets that they have targeted are hospitals, apartments, housing, and even schools! As a response to this invasion the United States has placed many sanctions on Russia and many private companies also have placed these sanctions on russia. Not only has the United States condemned this invasion, the grand majority of countries around the world condemn this invasion and have also placed some of their sanctions on Russia. The citizens of Ukraine have been extraordinarily brave, they are fighting alongside the military, some people who have never held or shot a gun are now joining the front lines to defend their country. Even the president of Ukraine is staying with his people and fighting alongside them. In Russia, many of the Russian citizens are protesting the invasion. Russia has increased its media censorship to prevent the citizens from discovering the truth. The Russian economy has not been doing so well either, due to all the

sanctions placed on them, their currency has collapsed. Because of all this going on, there is one main fear many people have, the fear that there will be another world war. Not only is that a fear to many, many also fear that this war could become nuclear and end up with human civilization collapsing. Let's take a step back and see how a world war could even start as a part of it. So far this is a regional conflict, even though other countries are helping Ukraine, they are not actively part of the war effort, they are not fighting. There are a few ways this could play out, firstly Russia could attack a NATO country meaning all other NATO countries have to fight alongside them. Another way this could play out if the US decides to send its own soldiers to Ukraine for some reason which would cause a war. In the event of a war chances are countries will use cyberwarfare, typical fighting, and worst of all: nuclear warheads. In the event Russia were to send some of their warheads to the US (keep in mind russia has the largest nuclear arsenal) the US will manage to blow many of them out of the sky, but unfortunately some will hit the US. Russia will most likely pick strategic targets to bomb, that means us Georgians are relatively safe but we will definitely see some explosions. Things like DC and parts of california and any other strategic targets will be destroyed, and those explosions would have vaporized and burned many of its victims. Here in Georgia we are relatively safe from a nuclear blast and the radiation, the wind blows it in a different direction. Thankfully we would be safe from burning to death and being vaporized, but there will be a new nightmare: water and food shortage. Even though Georgia

would be relatively unscathed, many other important parts of the US will be destroyed meaning food and supply shortage. Water will be contaminated, causing a water shortage. Because nuclear blasts partially emit an EMP and Russia may purposely emit EMP attacks on the US, many electronics will be destroyed. This includes computers, phones, smart devices, basically anything with a semiconductor chip. THis means that radio is your best bet to find someone and if there was any kind of machine that was protected from the EMP you could also use that for any kind of use. Many people will unfortunately be killed from the blast and more will die from radiation and starvation. This will be a similar fate in many countries that also have participated in the war. Russia will also suffer some damage, similar to the US. Overall this will lead to a main collapse in human civilization with very few working parts. Who knows how long it will take for society to rebuild, to at least get into a working state. The point is that there should never be a nuclear war and that it cannot be won, you cannot rule a dead world.
