

In This Corner of the World: A Review

The film "In This Corner of the World" is an excellent movie from the Japanese production company MAPPA depicting a slice of life type historical drama.

It takes place mostly in 1943-44 in Hiroshima and the nearby naval town of Kure. It follows the life of Suzu loves to draw, but at age 18 she is told an unknown young man has come to propose marriage to her. Leaving her home in Hiroshima to go to the naval town of Kure, a new phase of her life begins.

The animation is superb, and the English dub has excellent voice acting. I really enjoyed the part where Suzu met Tetsu by the shore, and he spoke of how the white rabbits leapt across the sea, the rabbits being a metaphor for the crashing waves. Suzu drew what he described, and this foreshadowed an event later in the movie.

I learned that life is a fragile, precious thing, and that war can be catastrophic and real, not just death tolls on a spreadsheet, that every number is a precious, precious life, needlessly lost over pointless battles.

I would recommend this to anyone who wants to feel what tragedy is truly like, and those who want to feel emotion again. I wouldn't recommend it to the squeamish or faint of heart, since there is a graphic sequence towards the end to help illustrate Hiroshimas true consequences, lending to its PG-13 rating.

Overall, I give this movie an A-, as it has amazing dubbing, it really helps push those emotions, and it excels at animation. The only drawbacks are a couple of plot points that I feel could be improved upon, and in many dialogue scenes, they sit there with closed mouths, so I wish they could of put a minimal lip-sync, but overall an amazing film
