

## Macy's Day Parade



### Background Info + History

The Macy's Day Parade is a nationally broadcasted Thanksgiving parade located in Manhattan, New York. It is held for three hours from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM. The Macy's department store presented its first parade 1924 New York City. It was actually a Christmas Day Parade at the time, The original parade followed a route along 145th Street and Convent Avenue to the Macy's store at 34th Street and Broadway.

### Events

This includes large floats that look like iconic characters, from Snoopy to Pikachu. They then cut out and go to commercial, but you can feel the excitement in the city that never sleeps. They would cut back and show a new or already existing new show that is coming or on Broadway. There are several performances that they cut to while the floats are going around. They also show some popular musicians who are waving to their fans down on the street. Near the end the turkey float comes out to represent that it is Thanksgiving with some pilgrims on the huge turkey. Usually a huge float comes out with one of the highlights of the parade, in the float is Santa Claus, in which they then wrap up the parade and wish everyone a happy Thanksgiving.
