What motivated you to want to become a school principal?

Mr. Peterson- "I like the phased approach, going from URL to Phase 1, then Phase 3 with 25 percent of our population at school, and full-time face to face on October 14. We have gotten good at social distancing. There are many students and staff, so we have been able to use the measures to keep everyone safe. This is a great gradual approach for full-time Face to Face. It has worked very well in my opinion."

How do see the school in a post-pandemic world? (new normal)

Mr. Peterson- "Something I have become accustomed to doing is monitoring the number of COVID cases. I cannot predict anything with full certainty. But most likely to keep everything safe. I do not think it will go away this school year. My sincere hope is that we can get to the pre-pandemic world as soon as possible and we can go back to our "old normal"

Do you speak multiple languages?

Mr. Peterson- "No, I do not speak multiple languages. I took Spanish as a course, but have not retained it enough to speak it"

Mr. Peterson- "My favorite sport is football, in particular college football. My favorite college team is Texas A&M. I am passionate about Texas A&M football."

Mr. Peterson- "I used to love to play, but now at my age, I am more for sitting back and watching, even though I like both."

Mr. Peterson- "U2 is my favorite band"

What is your Hobby?

Mr. Peterson- "My hobby is golf. I love to play golf with my daughter, and that is something we have become accustomed to."

Animal of the Month: Florida Panther by Harper Mayer and Zaira Qureshi



The Florida panther is one of the most endangered species in the world with only 120-130 left. It is a subspecies of the group *Puma concolor*, which includes cougars and mountain lions. The Florida panther lives in freshwater swamp forests in the Everglades in South Florida. Its diet consists of wild hogs, white-tailed deer, and other small mammals.

Panther kittens are born in dens built by their mothers. Kittens spend 6-8 weeks of their lives in these dens, being cared for by their mother. When kittens are two years old, they leave the dens and start hunting for themselves.

In the wild, Florida panthers face many threats. Their biggest predators are humans and the American alligator. Many panthers die each year due to automobile collisions. On top of that, Florida panthers can either be born with or develop severe heart problems.

In 1973, there were fewer than 36 panthers in the world. Thankfully, people are beginning to recognize the threat. The Nature Conservancy (TNC) and the Florida Panther Protection Program are some of the organizations trying to preserve the Florida panther.

In closing, the Florida panther is an amazing wildcat that deserves to stay alive for future generations.
